Fellowship Group Questions for Rehearsing God

Recall an embarrassing moment when you could not remember the name of a person you should have known.

Read Psalm 24.

Which part of this psalm stands out to you personally?

Read Psalm 50:10-12. How does this passage compare to the first line of Psalm 24? Both passages emphasize the sovereignty of God. The passage in Psalm 50 gives a little more detail.

Why should the truth of Psalm 24:1 be comforting? It's comforting because I can go to God with the cares and concerns that I have about the world around me and know that He is in control and knows all about what is happening.

If I find myself envying someone who has more than I do (more money, more stuff, etc.) how would rehearsing Psalm 24:1 help me? I'd be reminded that it's all God's and He can give whatever to whomever He wants. My job is to manage well what He has put in my hands.

How could a person's whole worldview be affected by their belief in Psalm 24:1?

- It would change their view on material things (materialism)
- It would change their view on the environment (environmentalism)
- It would change their view on people (humanitarianism)
- It would change their view on life (the sanctity of life)

How does Psalm 24:3-6 compare with Matthew 5:8? Psalm 24:3-6 says that purity is what it takes to get an audience with God. Jesus said that the pure of heart would see God. The word in the Psalms matches the word of Jesus—without purity no one gets an audience with God.

Read Hebrews 10:19-22. How is an audience with God made possible? Because of Jesus' death on the cross.

How do verses 7-10 tie into verses 1-2 of Psalm 24? Because God is Creator He is sovereign (He owns it all) which makes Him the ultimate King!
